












LIBRARY RESOLUTION 19-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE SIERRA MADRE PUBLIC LIBRARY TO ADOPT THE SIERRA MADRE PUBLIC LIBRARY CHILD SAFETY POLICY

WHEREAS, a primary responsibility given the Library Board of Trustees is the adoption of policies for the delivery of public Library services to residents in its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, according to the California Education Code, Title 1, Division 1, Part 11, Chapter 5, Articles 1-4, Sec. 18919. Rules, regulations and bylaws states, "The Board of Library Trustees may make and enforce all rules, regulations, and bylaws necessary for the administration, government, and protection of the libraries under its management, and all property belonging thereto", and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has approved and agreed upon the Child Safety Policy as developed by the City Librarian, in keeping with current professional practices, for the Sierra Madre Public Library,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of the Sierra Madre Public Library hereby:

Adopts by Resolution 18-01 the Sierra Madre Public Library STEAM Station Policy

SIERRA MADRE PUBLIC LIBRARY CHILD SAFETY POLICY

The Library welcomes children of all ages. Our goal is to provide a clean, safe, comfortable, and welcoming environment for all Library users. Our staff serves children by answering questions, assisting in the search for good books to read, providing materials to complete homework assignments, and presenting a variety of programing. However, staff cannot act in place of parents or serve as babysitters.

When using the Library with your child, patrons are encouraged to remember that it is a public place and open to all.

UNACCOMPANIED MINORS

To ensure the safety of children during their visit to the Library, the following policies have been adopted:

- Children under 8 years old must be accompanied by a caregiver age 13 or older.
- The child's caregiver must remain with the child at all times to ensure that all parties follow the Library Rules of Behavior. A parent or guardian will be notified if a child or youth continuously disregards the Library's Rules of Behavior.
- Library users, regardless of ages, are expected to follow the Library's Standards of Behavior.
- If a child under the age of 13 is left at the Library for more than 15 minutes after closing, the Sierra Madre Police Department will be called.

APPROPRIATE USE OF THE CHILDREN'S ROOM

Additionally, in order to ensure the safety and well-being of children and teens who use the library and to ensure that the use of the Children's room is consistent with the mission, vision and values of the Sierra Madre Public Library while maintaining an atmosphere of constructive library use, the following policy regarding the appropriate use of the Children's room is adopted.

- The materials, services and equipment in the Children's room is intended for the use of children, their parents and caregivers, and others needing children's materials and services for some specific purpose.
- Patrons not accompanying children ages 0-18 are required to use the furnishings in the remaining areas of the library.
