STAFF AND COMMISSION MEMBER REPORTS

Analyst Carlson reviewed the Public Works Department report. He provided a few highlights and updates to the materials included in the staff report. He highlighted the potential for leaving larger pieces of wood from Bailey Canyon removals. He also highlighted the area around E. Highland Ave., and N. Mountain Trail, commenting that staff and the arborist are now seeing sections of trees declining together. Finally he mentioned that the arborist was very impressed with a private Monterey Pine and the Commissioners may want to go by to see it.

Director Inman provided an update on the water conservation efforts. He also informed the Commission that the City Council voted to remain at a 30% conservation goal level, citing that basically, 30% conservation is the "new normal" and the sustainability of the aquifer is still important.

Commissioner Cossutta reported that she would like to recommend a movie titled "Bag It". It is a good documentary, informative as well as humorous. She wanted to know if it would

be possible to show the movie in a public forum. There may be a state-wide effort to address single-use bags in November. Other disposables should also be addressed.

Commissioner Shuster reported that she had read a Nature Conservancy article. Sally Jewel, Secretary of the Interior, refers to President Obama's Every Kid in a Park Initiative that provides every 4th grader and their family's free access to National Parks for a year. Perhaps that can tie into Commissioner Cossutta's ongoing work with the schools. She provided the article.
